

# **How can i ...? What's the meaning of ...? with the PDF-Analyzer Pro**

## **How can i ...?**

In the file "Getting\_started.pdf" or in the install-menu at item "Getting started" you'll find samples how to use the PDF-Analyzer Pro.

## **What are the differences between a main and a user password?**

With a main password you can protect the internal settings of a pdf-document regarding layout, functionalities and display options.

The main password isn't a very strong one.

If there's a user password you even can't read/see the pdf-document. While loading first a small popup opens where you have to insert the user password. If it's correct the document opens.

The user password is a pretty strong (and save) one but it makes pdf-handling uncomfortable.

A user password always needs the basic main password.

## **Why i see a "No" in some settings obviously i've selected a "Yes"?**

Perhaps you've selected 40-bit-encryption. With this older encryption mode you can't set few security options. For example the permission to fill formfields is such an option.

## **Can i remove unknown passwords?**

User passwords are very save and i don't know a tool for removing user passwords from pdf files. However the PDF-Analyzer Pro is able to reset the main password and the complete security settings with one mouse click. Now there's no need to be frightened because of the forgetting of passwords and the losing of resource files anymore!

## **What does this mean "Copying allowed - Yes/No"?**

Naturally you can copy a pdf file from one directory to the other for example - it doesn't matter if this option is set or not. "Copying allowed - No" means that it's not possible to select content of a displayed pdf file (perhaps an image or a text part) and to copy it into the clipboard.
